London's iconic 2256-seat Covent Garden (1858) in the heart of London's theatre district is home to Britain's oldest opera and ballet companies: **The Royal Opera** is under the artistic direction of newly appointed Music Director **Jakub Hrůša** and Director

of Opera **Oliver Mears**; **The Royal Ballet** is under the artistic directorship of Music Director **Koen Kessels** and Director **Kevin O'Hare**.

LA SCALA

Via Filodrammatici, 2, 20121 Milano MI

The most famous opera house in the world, Milan's **Teatro alla Scala** (1778) is the birthplace of the artform. The simple exterior reserves the opulence for within. Apart from its sheet beauty and size (2200 seats), **La Scala**'s acoustics are said to be



perfect. The venue is home to the La Scala Theatre Chorus, Ballet and Orchestra, as well as the La Scala Theatre Academy. **Riccardo Chailly** is in his final year as Music Director and Principal Conductor, and will be succeeded in 2027 by **Myung-whun Chung**.



OPÉRA NATIONAL DE PARIS

Palais Garnier, Pl. de l'Opéra, 75009 Paris Opéra Bastille, Pl. de la Bastille, 75012 Paris

Founded more than three centuries ago by Louis XIV, **Opéra National de Paris** holds performances across two theatres, the 1970-seat Palais Garnier (1875) (pictured)

and the 2700-seat Opéra Bastille (1989). Opéra de Paris is currently under the direction of **Alexander Neef**. The Paris Opera Ballet's Director of Dance is former Etoile **José Martinez**

A must-see will be the third instalment of **Barrie Kosky**'s intensely theatrical *Ring Cycle. Siegfried* stars the indefatigable **Andreas Schager** with **Christopher Maltman** reprising his acclaimed portrayal of Wotan. The world will be watching as Covent Garden screens its new *Tosca*, conducted my incoming Music Director **Jakub Hrūša** and marking the controversial return to the London stage of Russian soprano **Anna Netrebko**. London also offers strong revivals: *The Magic Flute* with **Julia Bullock** as Pamina and *La traviata* with **Ermonela Jaho**, very much the Violetta of the day.

The La Scala season is equally impressive. There's a new production of Shostakovich's Lady Macbeth of Mtsensk conducted by outgoing Music Director Riccardo Chailly, a new Carmen conducted by incoming Music Director Myung-whun Chung and a new Cosi fan tutte from Canadian director Robert Carsen. Most intriguing is the world premiere of an operatic adaptation of



Umberto Eco's medieval thriller *The Name* of the Rose.

Elsewhere, the new Naples staging of Cherubini's *Medea* with **Sondra Radvanovsky** should be gripping, ditto **Damiano Michieletto**'s *Lohengrin*. There's Netrebko again in *Un ballo in maschera* from Paris, and a fascinating attempt in Rome to recreate the original production of *Tosca* 125 years on.

Ballet fans, meanwhile, can look forward to Australian rising star **Navrin Turnbull** dancing the lead to Grieg's music in Edward Clug's new *Peer Gynt* from La Scala. There are plenty of revivals, too, including encore screenings of **Angelin Preljocaj**'s Enlightenment-inspired *Le Parc*, a new performance of **Wayne McGregor**'s *Woolf Works* with a haunting score by **Max Richter**, two *Giselles* (one from London, one from Paris) and the ever-popular Covent Garden stagings of Frederick Ashton's *Cinderella* and *La fille mal gardée*."

The Name of the Rose

New Production! Palace Opera & Ballet is delighted to open the 2025-26 Cinema Season with **Damiano Michieletto**'s world premiere staging of the gripping new opera from **Francesco Filidei**, a co-commission between La Scala and Opéra de Paris. Based on Umberto Eco's award-winning medieval thriller, the story follows a 14th Century Franciscan friar William of Baskerville (Grammy Award-winning baritone Lucas Meachem) and his apprentice Adso (star mezzo-soprano **Kate Lindsey**) as they investigate a series of mysterious deaths among the monks at a remote monastery, uncovering a labyrinthine library and a web of secrets. Immersive and texturally rich, Filedei's composition is built on a symphonic base, layered with a series of arias and recitatives that transform traditional Gregorian chants. Leading the La Scala Orchestra and a chorus of more than 150 singers is **Ingo Metzmacher**.



New Production! Acclaimed choreographer Edward **Clug**'s striking and poetic contemporary ballet, based on the classic Ibsen play of the same name, comes to La Scala for the first time. Follow the fantastical and tumultuous journey of the impulsive Peer (Australian rising star **Navrin Turnbull**), who abandons his humble origins in search of adventure and glory. Peer's travels take him through imaginative landscapes - from the mountains of Norway, through the kingdom of the trolls, to the deserts of North Africa - only to return to Solveig (Alice **Mariani**), whose enduring love offers him a chance at redemption and meaning. New Production! The splendour of Rome. The devastation of war. Puccini's operatic thriller returns in an unmissable, gripping new production by **Oliver Mears**, the first to be conducted by Music Director of The Royal Opera Jakub Hrůša in his new role. Floria Tosca (Anna Netrebko) and Mario Cavaradossi (Freddie De Tommaso) live for each other and for their art. But when Cavaradossi helps an escaped prisoner, the lovers make a deadly enemy in the form of Baron Scarpia (Grammywinning bass-baritone **Gerald Finley**), Chief of Police. At the mercy of Scarpia's twisted desires, Tosca is forced to make a horrific bargain: sleeping with the man she hates in order to save the man she loves. Can she find a way out?

Encore Screenings! As the ultimate romantic ballet Giselle wows audiences in Paris with another sold-out run, here's a chance to revisit a classic performance. The story begins like a fairy tale: a charming peasant girl Giselle (stunning étoile **Dorothée Gilbert**) falls in love with Albrecht (Mathieu Ganio), whom she believes to be a simple villager, but who is actually a duke. However, Albrecht is already promised to someone else, and when Giselle discovers this, she goes mad and dies, joining the Wilis-ghostly girls betrayed by unfaithful lovers. Will Giselle seek revenge by luring Albrecht to his death, or will she let love and forgiveness triumph? First performed in 1841, the ballet by Jules Perrot and Jean Coralli marked a new era in Western dance. Pointe shoes, arabesques, and white tutus evoke a fantastical, diaphanous world that has become the very embodiment of romanticism.

65 years after its premiere, The Royal Ballet invites you to (re)discover Frederick Ashton's ballet of pure sunshine. Lise (Francesca Hayward), the only daughter of Widow Simone, is in love with the young farmer Colas (Marcelino Sambé), but her mother has far more ambitious plans for her. Simone hopes to marry her off to Alain, the son of the wealthy proprietor Thomas. Desperate to marry Colas rather than Alain, Lise contrives to outwit her mother's plans. Whisking us away into pastoral bliss with Hérold's cheerful score and **Osbert Lancaster**'s colourful designs, this affectionate portrayal of village life combines exuberant good humour and brilliantly inventive choreography in what is undoubtedly Ashton's love letter to the English countryside. It's pure joy.

This year, the company marks the 50th anniversary of Shostakovich's death with a new staging of his masterpiece. The story follows Katerina (American soprano Sara Jakubiak), the lonely young wife of a merchant, who begins a passionate affair with one of his workers, Sergey (acclaimed tenor Najmiddin Mavlyanov), commencing a cycle of violence that will lead her to ruin. Maestro Riccardo Chailly (pictured) conducts one of 20th Century opera's most powerful scores, celebrated for its raw emotional force, vivid orchestration, and unflinching portrayal of passion.

As part of a bet with Don Alfonso (**Gerald Finley**), Ferrando and Guglielmo (Giovanni Sala and Luca Micheletti) must try to seduce each other's fiancées, Fiordiligi and Dorabella (Elsa Dreisig and Nina van **Essen**). When both yield, and the ruse is revealed, all four must reckon with the fallout. 

Giselle

The peasant girl Giselle has fallen in love with Albrecht. When she discovers that he is actually a nobleman promised to another, she kills herself in despair. Her spirit joins the Wilis: the vengeful ghosts of women hell-bent on killing any man who crosses their path in a dance to the death. Set to Adolphe Adam's evocative score and with atmospheric designs by **John Macfarlane**, Giselle conjures up the earthly and otherworldly realms in a tale of love, betrayal and redemption.


